DWELLING IN THE SECRET PLACE



The world around us sees Him in our words, our actions, and our character. Anything short of this—the idea of dwelling without being transformed—is a contradiction, an aberration. Dwelling in God's presence must lead to a complete transformation of our lives.

Consider it this way: when you frequently visit a place where the atmosphere is filled with cigarette smoke and alcohol, eventually, you'll start smelling of smoke. The scent clings to you. In the same way, when you immerse yourself in the presence of God, you begin to carry the fragrance of His love, grace, and holiness. You can't help but start reflecting His nature because you've spent time with Him, absorbing His presence. As you dwell in the secret place, His character, wisdom, and peace become part of you. You "smell like God," act like God, and reflect His qualities because you have been in His presence.

But this only happens if we fully submerge ourselves. Dwelling in God's presence requires more than a quick visit—it's a wholehearted, all-in commitment to be influenced by Him. It's allowing Him to interact with you, inspect your heart, and diagnose areas of your life that need healing or change. This time with God shapes us to look more and more like Him.

Just as Moses' face shone after spending forty days and nights on the mountain with God (Exodus 34:29):, our lives should shine with the evidence of our time in His presence. Moses was physically transformed, and so should we be. It's impossible to dwell in God's presence and remain unchanged. If we are dwelling with Him, people around us should be able to see a difference in how we live, speak, and treat others.



DWELLING IN GOD'S SHADOW

When we say we dwell under the shadow of the Almighty, it signifies a complete trust in God. Picture this: if you're hiding in someone's shadow, they are in front of you, taking the heat of the sun and sheltering you. This is exactly what it means to live under God's shadow. God stands in front of us, bearing the heat and weight of life's pressures while we rest, hidden in His presence.

To dwell under God's shadow is to place complete faith in Him to handle the challenges and hardships we face. It's recognizing that He is the primary figure in our lives, and we're positioned under His protective care. In every trial, we trust that He will defend, provide, and guide us. When we abide in His shadow, we allow Him to bear the brunt of life's battles on our behalf. We don't have to fight for ourselves, as He covers us in His protection.

This doesn't mean life will always be easy. But it does mean that when storms come, we can rest assured that God will handle them. When we dwell under His shadow, He becomes our source of strength, our defender, and the One who takes the lead. We need not fear what comes our way because we are secure under His care.

A LIFE OF PEACE AND PROTECTION

The promise of dwelling in God's shadow is vividly described in Psalms 91:7: "A thousand may fall at your side, and ten thousand at your right hand; but it shall not come near you." This verse speaks to the profound protection we experience when we're living under God's covering. Though trouble may surround us, we remain untouched. When challenges or attacks arise, they come against God first, as we are hidden under His shadow

Imagine this: you're tucked away in God's secret place, and though there is chaos outside, you are safely hidden, untouched by the turmoil around you. This is the promise of God for those who dwell in His presence. Life's difficulties may surround us, but they cannot reach us because we are shielded by God Himself. The "thousand" and "ten thousand" represent the troubles, fears, and pressures of life that threaten to overwhelm us.
