INTRODUCTION: A WORD FOR A FEW

I remember sitting quietly one morning, studying as the Lord had instructed—soaking in the stillness, wrapped in the peace of His presence. I already had the devotional theme for May planned out since January. But that morning, as I sat before Him, something shifted. The Lord met me in the volume of His Word. As I read, what began as a personal time of devotion quickly turned into a divine encounter. The Scriptures opened up, speaking not just to my mind, but deeply into my spirit. I was receiving the Word for myself—correction, alignment, instruction. Then, mid-way, the Lord whispered:

“This word is not just for you. Let it go out—there are others who need it too.”

That whisper was clear, weighty, and undeniable. It wasn't a loud voice, but it pierced through my thoughts with conviction. I knew then that this wasn't a general message. It's a prophetic instruction for a few people. If it's you, you'll know. As you read, the power of the Holy Spirit will grip your heart, convict you, and confirm that this word was sent to meet you exactly where you are.

So, I invite you—read slowly, prayerfully, and with a heart ready to respond. This isn't just another devotional. It's a divine instruction. And the Lord, who works in us both to will and to do of His good pleasure, will also give you grace to obey in Jesus name Amen.

DISCRETION: GUARD WHAT GOD IS DOING IN YOUR LIFE

“Now when they had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream, saying, ‘Arise, take the young Child and His mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I bring you word; for Herod will seek the young Child to destroy Him.’” — Matthew 2:13 (NKJV)
Even though Jesus is the Son of God—with all power and angelic backup—God still told Joseph to flee. Why? Because discretion is wisdom. The fact that you're called, anointed, and chosen doesn't mean you should expose everything God is doing in your life. There are still "Herods" today—systems, people, and spirits that seek to abort the prophecy over your head.

In Matthew 2 and 3, we see that even Jesus' life was strategically hidden. After the incident at the temple when He was twelve, He disappeared from public record until He was thirty. Why? Because not every season is meant for display. Some seasons are for growth, preparation, and protection. You must not live a loud life. Not everything is for social media. Not every relationship, opportunity, breakthrough, or testimony is meant to be shared publicly. Learn to carry your prophecy with quiet reverence. What God is doing in you is holy—don't expose it to premature warfare.

“A fool vents all his feelings, but a wise man holds them back.” — Proverbs 29:11

“The secret of the Lord is with those who fear Him...” — Psalm 25:14

Let the Holy Spirit guide you on what to share, when to speak, and when to hide. Your silence may just be the weapon that preserves your destiny.

NOTHING HAPPENS BY MISTAKE - ITS' ALL DIVINE PLAN

"...He shall be called a Nazarene." — Matthew 2:23

"And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose." — Romans 8:28.

Sometimes life feels chaotic, unpredictable, and painful. You may be in a place you never planned to be, facing situations you never prayed for. But here's the truth: there are no accidents in your journey with God.

When Herod died, the angel told Joseph to return to Israel. But Joseph was afraid of Herod's son, so he went to Galilee instead—and settled in Nazareth, fulfilling prophecy. At the time, it looked like a detour, but it was God's divine rerouting.

Even your fears, delays, detours, and past mistakes are being used to fulfil prophecy. God is not reacting to your life—He's directing it. What seems like a "change of plans" is often His perfect plan unfolding.

"The steps of a good man are ordered by the Lord..." — Psalm 37:23

"I know the plans I have for you..." — Jeremiah 29:11

You may not understand now, but nothing is wasted—not the heartbreak, not the job loss, not the delay in marriage, not the confusion. In time, you will see how every thread is part of a beautiful, divine plan.

HUMILITY PRECEDES HONOUR - LET GOD ANNOUNCE YOU

"Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan to be baptized by him." — Matthew 3:13

"But John tried to deter Him, saying, 'I need to be baptized by You, and are You coming to me?' Jesus replied, 'Let it be so now; it is proper for us to do this to fulfill all righteousness.'" — Matthew 3:14-15

This is one of the most profound moments in the life of Jesus. The Son of God—the Creator of the universe—submitted Himself to be baptized by His creation. Why? Because humility is the pathway to honour.

Immediately after this act of humility, the heavens opened, the Holy Spirit descended like a dove, and a voice declared, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." (Matthew 3:17)

Many today want God to announce them but don't want to bow their heads. They want platforms but refuse submission. They seek honour but walk in pride. But God will never lift what pride has puffed up.

Stop boasting. Stop exaggerating your life. Stop living to impress others or to prove a point. God cannot fill a vessel that is full of self. Allow Him to empty you so that He can announce you at the right time.

"Humble yourselves before the Lord, and He will lift you up." — James 4:10

"Before honour comes humility." — Proverbs 15:33

Let your greatness come from God's voice, not your own. The most powerful announcement is not the one you make—it's the one heaven makes on your behalf.

FINAL WORD

This is a word for a few. Maybe you've felt the Holy Spirit stir you as you read. If so, receive this word with reverence. The Lord is warning, guiding, and preparing you.

- Be discreet.
- Trust God's Divine plan.
- Walk in deep humility.

If you can do these three, you will see the hand of God move powerfully in your life this year in Jesus name Amen.

PRAYER

Lord, I thank You for this word. I receive it with fear, with reverence, and with obedience. Help me to live a quiet and discerning life. Help me to trust Your process, even when I do not understand it. Empty me of pride, Lord, and teach me to walk humbly with You, that You may lift me in due season. In Jesus' name, Amen.
